Statement of Attainment towards or Certificate
CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support

This qualification reflects the role of workers in the community and/or residential setting who follow an individualised plan to provide person-centred support to people who may require support due to ageing, disability or some other reason. Work involves using discretion and judgement in relation to individual support as well as taking responsibility for own outputs. Workers have a range of factual, technical and procedural knowledge, as well as some theoretical knowledge of the concepts and practices required to provide person-centred support.

- Assist with initial and ongoing health assessments and the maintenance of patients' health
- Observe, measure and record patients' conditions (their temperature, pulse, respiration, blood pressure and blood sugar levels, for example)
- Report changes in patients' conditions
- Attend to patients' hygiene & comfort by assisting with bathing, showering, dressing and bed-making
- Assist patients with meals when required
- Assist patients with rehabilitation exercises & programmes
- Assist in emergency situations
- Assist in educating on health & lifestyle issues
- Maintain a safe environment for patients and assist with the prevention of injuries.

- Tolerant, patient and tactful when dealing with people of different backgrounds, ages and cultures
- Able to follow instructions precisely
- Able to work as part of a team
- Able to cope with the physical and psychological demands of the job
- Able to solve problems and make decisions

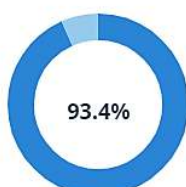

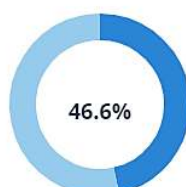
STUDENT OUTCOMES FOR CERTIFICATE III IN INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT
