The qualification may be completed post school as part of an apprenticeship. Occupational titles may include plumber, gasfitter and drainer and outcomes will be dependent on streams undertaken within the course.

- Tests

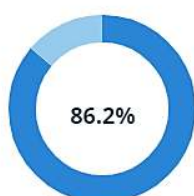
DUTIES AND TASKS OF A PLUMBER

- collaborate with contractors, construction workers, electricians and pipefitters in installing and repairing plumbing
- install pipes and fixtures, such as sinks and toilets, for water, gas, steam, air, or other liquids
- interpret blueprints and building specifications to map layout for pipes, drainage systems, and other plumbing materials
- follow health and safety standards and comply with building codes
- analyse problem and identify appropriate tools and materials for repair
- modify length of pipes, fixtures, and other plumbing materials as needed for a building
- perform inspections of plumbing systems to identify and replace worn parts

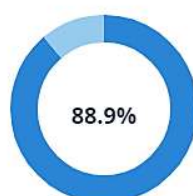
STUDENT OUTCOMES FOR CERTIFICATE III IN PLUMBING

Installs, maintains, and repairs pipes and fixtures associated with heating, cooling, water distribution, and sanitation systems in residential and commercial structures. Fixes domestic appliances, such as dishwashers and gas cookers. Inspects drainage and other plumbing systems for compliance with local and national regulations.
